Repeat Infringer Policy

Qured has adopted a "Repeat Infringer Policy" in accordance with section 116AH(1) of the Copyright Act 1968 and reserves the right to suspend, limit or terminate an account holder's service in accordance with this policy. Qured will not volunteer your personal details or information relating to customers to copyright holders, unless they obtain an Australian legal court order which requires us to identify who you are.
